- Counseling, information, and resource referrals

By Appt Services

- Low cost wellness clinics (free exam with veterinarian, preventative wellness care)
- Free spay/neuter for dogs & cats (with transport)

Additional programming:

Temporary care for pet while owner secures housing or receives medical attention. Program limited and case-by-case basis. Multiple partners make this program possible (Shelter, pet sitting co, daycare, etc)








