4. In the U.S., nonprofits were created by white women to help...who?

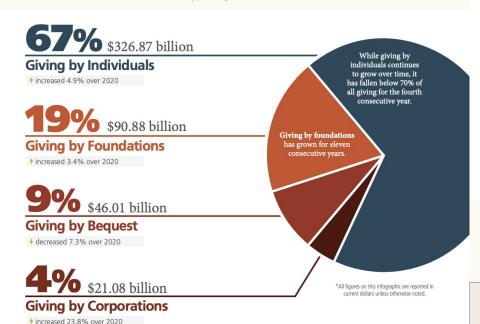

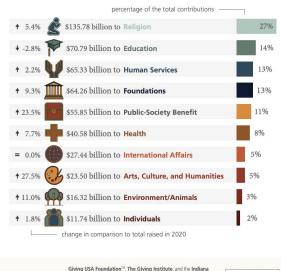
#### Where did the generosity come from?

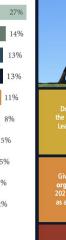

Several subsectors that struggled in 2020, such as giving to health and arts, culture, and humanities, experienced recoveries in 2021.

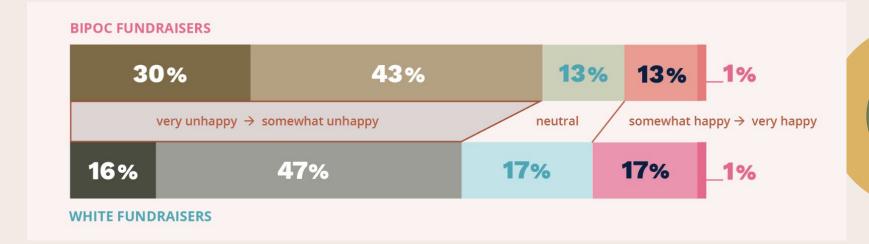


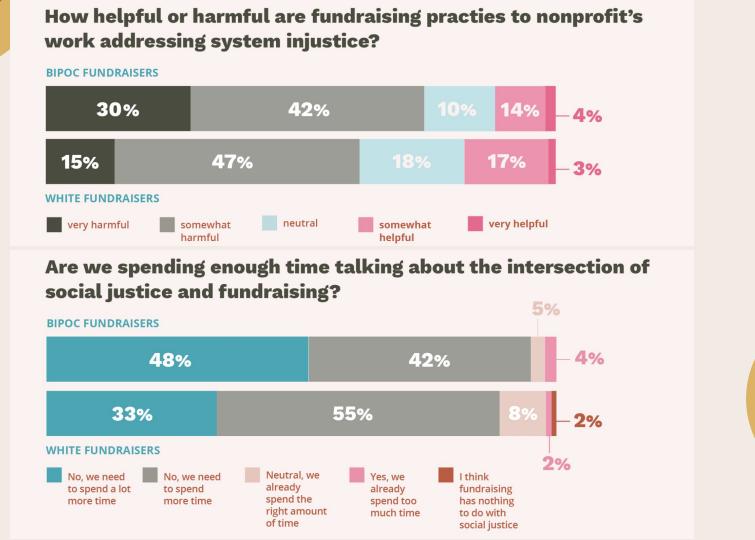

# CCF: A Set of Principles + Values Framework

#### **Ask the Question:**

- WHO makes decisions?
- WHY do they have that power?
- WHO is defining equity?
- WHY is that standard being set?
- WHAT can I do?

## 11 Principles

- 1. Fundraising must be grounded in *race*, equity and *social justice*.
- Individual org missions are not as important as the collective community.
- 3. Nonprofits are generous with and mutually supportive of one another.
- 4. All who engage in strengthening the community are equally valued.
- 5. *Time* is valued as equally as money.
- 6. We treat donors as partners and this means we are transparent and occasionally have difficult conversations.

- 7. We foster a sense of belonging, *not othering*.
- 8. We promote the understanding that everyone personally benefits from engaging in the work of social justice not just charity and compassion.
- 9. We see the work of social justice as holistic and transformative, not transactional.
- 10. We recognize that healing and liberation require a commitment to economic justice.
- 11. We commit to the work of internal, interpersonal, and interorganizational healing.
