I think we should treat each animal and each adopter as an individual, and realize that people (and animals) change over time, so we should work with them in the current context, using the past as information that is helpful.

We are a cat only shelter and have a no declaw contract as part of our adoption process. We discuss this with every adopter and most people who want to declaw don't understand what it actually entails. Our job is to educate. There's so many ways to keep cats from clawing without actually declawing, so we share that information

Here at Homeward Bound Pet Adoption Center in Blackwood, NJ, if anyone states they are for declawing we do not adopt too. We will educate and explain the reasons why you should not declaw.

Such a great point, Allison -- and people have all kinds of preconceived ideas of what the adoption process may be like which can increase that intimidation factor even before they interact with us. When we consider that, it's such a brave and exciting choice for people to choose adoption

We do follow up, and it gives us the opportunity to head off any potential issues with settling in, such as introductions with other pets etc. We're a private shelter but we're bringing volunteers on to help with volume of follow ups

We have a 6 month card with a before and after picture of dog and offer help and ask for volunteering

We do so much follow-up! We provide lifetime behavioral support so the earlier that we can connect with people and identify challenges, the better

We are absolutely a resource for our adopters for the life of the kitty. At time of adoption, we give them all the ways they can reach out to us. But we don't have time to follow up with each adoption. The only time we do this is when we have a cat adopted with a medical condition. Then it's just checking in on them to be sure their condition is being maintained and they don't need help.

Our County zoning will not allow more than three dogs per household unless you live in a rural area. Would you deny if they revealed they already have three?

When I started as an Adoption Manager, we made a lot of changes to our adoption questionnaire and process. We sat down as a team and, line by line, talked about why we asked a question to an adopter and what we were trying to achieve. I got buy-in to make changes for a 90-day trial and then we would regroup and talk about how it went.
