Mission Statement

The Florida Keys Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals is the Florida Keys largest, non-profit animal adoption shelter. The Florida Keys SPCA is dedicated to promoting the humane treatment of all animals through compassionate care, adoption, education, population control and humane law enforcement.

We accept all animals and do not turn any animals away. We have no time limits on our adoptable animals and we do not euthanize for space. Animals are assessed both behaviorally and medically before they are place in to the adoption program. Unless there are medical or behavioral issues that develop deeming an animal un-adoptable, the animal will stay in our adoption program until they find their forever home. The FKSPCA also works closely with other animal welfare agencies and transfers animals that may be more suited to a breed specific rescue.



- 6) Board of Directors




Volunteer Expectations

- *2- 1 Hour Walking Trainings with K9 Coach

Advanced Behavior Training

Greeter, Tour Guide, Office Assistant (Oh My!)

• **Greeter:** Greet visitors, potential adopters and donor when they arrive at shelter. Direct them where they have interests in visiting.

• Tour Guide: For those interested in being personally shown around the building,

giving a detailed guide of the facility.

• Office Assistant: When not greeting & touring, assisting the Office staff by answering phones, helping customers, computer entry, lost & found calls, donation distribution, etc.

• 1 Hour Training + 1-2 Shadow Sessions depending on level of interest.



Clinic Assistant

- Volunteers are needed for a number of positions in our clinic including but not limited to:
 - Clinic Admin Desk- Check in clients, data entry, discharge clients
 - Pre Operation Assistant- Taking vitals, weights, etc.
 - Post Operation Assistant- Waking animals up, looking for signs of stress, etc.
 - Laundry, clean up and stocking of supplies.
- Clinic Manager will contact you directly for training!
- If you are interested, your information will be passed along to our Clinic Manager.



Special Events & Fundraisers

 Because the FKSPCA is not under the umbrella of, or funded by any other national humane organization, we rely on donations from members of the community to support our programs.

Special Events are a fun way to engage with members of our community and raise

awareness of all we do at the shelter!

 Our events range from Yappy Hours to a Dog Festival to a Beer Pong Tournament to a formal gala to a social to a Fantasy Fest event and everything in between!

- We are part of or put on over 40 events a year, so volunteer support is critical to make them a success!

Kids Club Leaders

- Our new Kids Club will be for our Youth Volunteers ages 10-15.
- Our Kids Club will be available 2-3 days per week for 1 hour sessions.
- We will be having them make toys, snacks, other enrichment items, reading to the animals, etc for part of the session, then have animal interaction time.
- We are looking for volunteers interested in leading these sessions!







Foster Program

- We use Fosters for several different reasons:
 - Puppies or kittens that are too young to be in a shelter environment.
 - Medical reasons: Post surgery recovery, heartworm treatment, etc.
 - Behavior reasons: Stress, separation anxiety, etc

• Hurricane Fosters care for the animals in the event of a storm that will directly

impact the lower keys.

• Foster receive all supplies from us that they would need. As a Foster, you would just provide the safe place for the animal to go.
